To save lots of precious materials from going to waste, wouldn't it make sense to design mobile phones so we can recover and reuse materials easily to make new

phones? Could we design phones that pop apart in a few seconds with heat or electric magnets: screws that push themselves out, circuit boards that pop off and glues that melt or dissolve. Some companies are exploring these ideas.
